Frequently Asked Questions

How much does it cost?

\$5950.00 Canadian. Included in the cost are all organized field trips, including ferries, and all accommodations. Also included is breakfast and dinner daily in Sicily and Tunisia, 75 hours of instruction, including darkroom. Computer time is available at a reasonable cost.

Not included is the cost of travel to and from Malta. Students are responsible for meals (except on the Sicily and Tunisia trips - breakfast and dinner provided), photographic film and paper, processing of slide film (\$14/roll), and spending money of course.

Where do we stay?

We stay at the University Residence in Lija, Malta, which is a safe, centrally located village close to bus routes, shops, and services. Valletta, the capital, is about 20 minutes away by bus.



What is an average day like?

Most mornings and occasional evenings are in the darkroom. Afternoons are usually free. On field trips, there is no darkroom work; instead the emphasis is on taking photos.

Should I bring my own camera and film?

Please bring a digital camera. We will also be using film, but if you do not have a film camera, dave will

provide you with one.Students should bring their own cameras, preferably a single-lens reflex since this type allows for more creative control. Film can be purchased on the island, but it's recommended you bring: minimum ten 36-exposure rolls of black-and-white (Ilford HP-5 ISO 400), fifteen 36-exp. rolls of colour slide film (Fuji Provia ISO 100). Of course you can always bring extras! Students will also need two packages of 25 sheets of paper for darkroom printing—Agfa RC base, variable contrast.

Who goes on this trip?

The program is designed for students ages 14-19, from beginner to advanced levels. Instruction will be tailored to the individual's needs. Previous experience with photography is not a prerequisite for this program.

Tour Details

Students will learn the basics of black-and-white and colour photography in the beautiful Mediterranean country of Malta. This former British colony has the

enviable reputation as being the safest country in all of Europe. Its inhabitants speak English as well as the native Malti. It is well-known for its archaeological treasures, several of which pre-date the Pyramids and Stonehenge, as well as its stunning rocky coastline.

From our base in the capital of Valletta we will explore the history, culture, and landscapes of the area as well as neighbouring Sicily and Tunisia. Classroom instruction is provided, but the emphasis is on learning by doing. Professional photographers will provide individual instruction in the field and in the darkroom to maximize each student's learning experience.

Stops include The Palace of the Knights of Malta, St John's Co-Cathedral, the Balzan and Lija festivals, the walled medieval city of Mdina, and of course the miles of sunny beaches and interesting shops.

Sicily

We will visit: Agrigento, with the 5th century BC ruins of The Valley of Temples and Siracusa, with picturesque 1st-century BC ruins of the once-great city. We will spend several days in Novara di Sicilia, a mountain village in Northeast Sicily. From here we will make day trips to the surrounding area.

Tunisia

Our bus tour will run from the Mediterranean to the Sahara Desert. We start at Carthage before driving south to El Jem, whose 2nd-century BC coliseum is the best preserved in the world, only slightly smaller than its famous cousin in Rome. We will stay at "Luke Skywalker's house" in Matmata, home of cave-dwelling people and the filming site of the Star Wars movies. We will also visit Tataouine, which is not a planet



but a city and ancient Berber stronghold, recently featured in The Phantom Menace. We'll be based in Ksar Ghilane, for a camel safari into the Sahara desert of North Africa.
